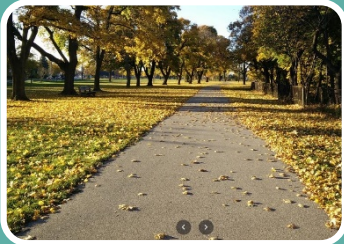
SURVEY #1 OVERVIEW

Survey respondents indicated that they want to protect the mature trees and passive feel of the park and would like to see the existing elements improved with one or two additions that are active.



Amenities survey respondents most wanted to see improved and / or added:

- Trail system
- Protection of mature trees and tree planting
- Lighting
- Connection to lower city
- Spray pad and Washroom building



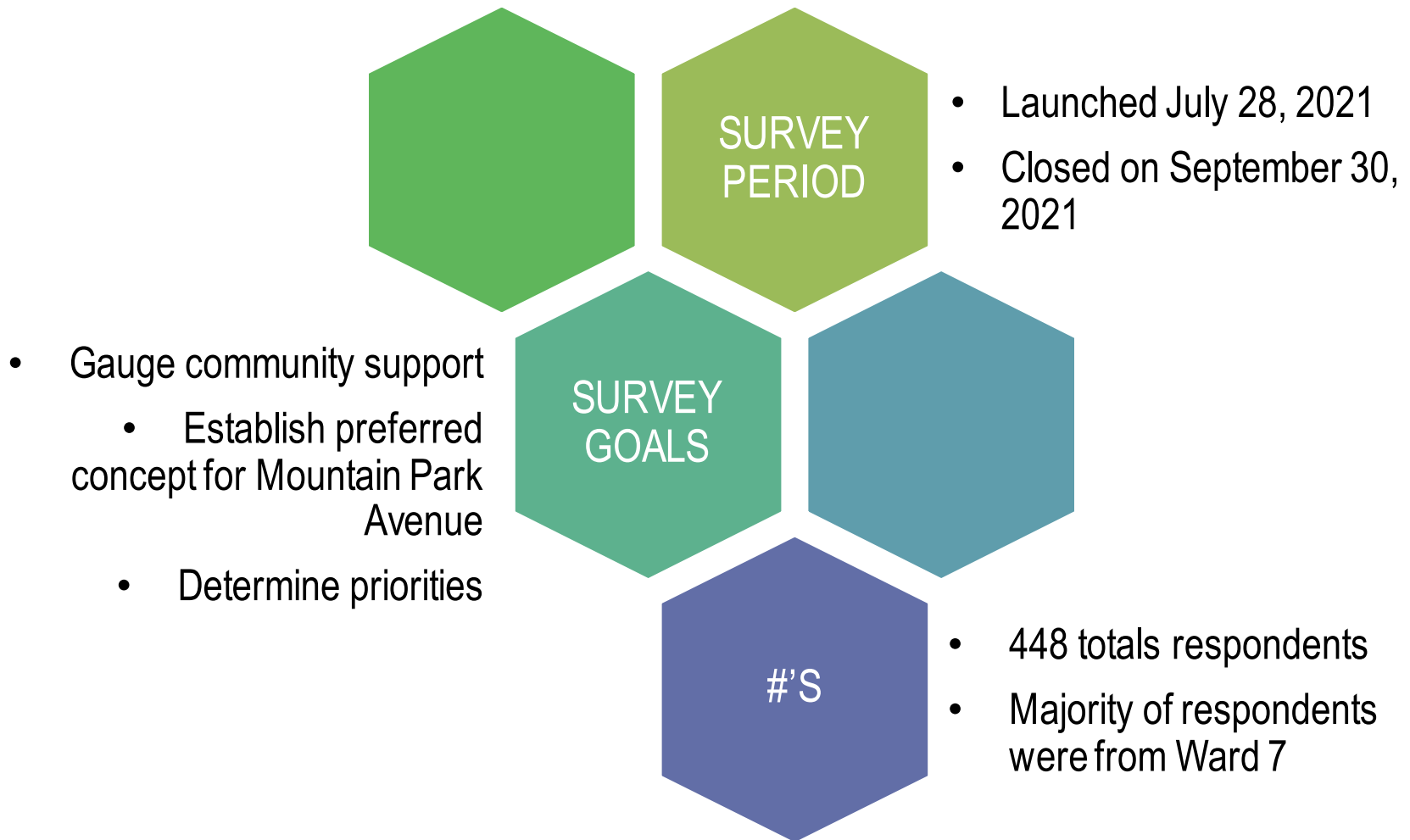
The amenities survey respondents least wanted to see improved and / or added:

- Fenced in dog area

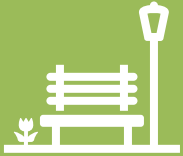
